# **KENYA CHRISTIAN ASSEMBLY HEADQUARTERS RELOCATION REPORT**

## **1. Executive Summary**

This report details the strategic relocation of the Kenya Christian Assembly's headquarters. It outlines the challenges encountered at our previous location and highlights the significant opportunities presented by our new property. Furthermore, it provides a comprehensive financial overview of the acquisition and clarifies the profound impact this move will have on our ministry and community outreach efforts.

## **2. Background: Challenges at the Previous Headquarters**

The former location of our church headquarters presented several significant challenges that adversely affected our ministry's growth and the accessibility for our congregants. The property was situated in an unsecured environment, posing safety concerns for our members and assets. Additionally, it suffered from inadequate transportation infrastructure, including unpaved and often impassable muddy roads, which made access particularly difficult, especially during adverse weather conditions. These persistent issues necessitated a critical re-evaluation of our operational base to better serve our growing community.

## **3. The New Vision: A Strategic Relocation**

We are immensely grateful to God for His divine guidance and provision, which has led us to a more suitable and strategically advantageous location for our new headquarters. This new property is conveniently situated within the town, approximately 800 meters from the town center, ensuring enhanced accessibility for all. It boasts direct access via a well-maintained tarmac road, significantly improving transportation.

The acquired property spans an **acre of land** and includes a substantial existing building capable of accommodating up to **1,500 people simultaneously**. This facility is poised to become the central hub for all Kenya Christian Assembly services and will officially serve as the new **National Headquarters**. In a significant step forward, our **Bible College** will also be relocated to this new venue, consolidating our educational and worship activities under one roof.





## 4. Financial Overview of the Acquisition

The total investment required for the acquisition of this new land and its existing structure is **KSh 3.2 Million**, which is equivalent to approximately **\$24,640 USD**.

Through the steadfast commitment and generous contributions of our members, the Kenya Christian Assembly has can successfully raise **KSh 1 Million** towards this vital acquisition and the initial necessary improvements to the facility. This leaves a remaining balance of **KSh 2.2 Million**, equivalent to approximately **\$16,940 USD**, required to complete the purchase and foundational enhancements.

To further support this ambitious project and ensure the seamless continuation of God's work, the previous church property, from which we have relocated, will be made available for rent. The proceeds generated from this rental income will be exclusively allocated towards the ongoing operations, maintenance, and development of our new headquarters and various church ministries.

## 5. Future Impact and Conclusion

This strategic relocation represents a monumental milestone in the journey of the Kenya Christian Assembly. It directly addresses the long-standing challenges related to security, accessibility, and infrastructure that previously hindered our outreach. The new headquarters will facilitate expanded ministry opportunities, foster deeper community engagement (Orphanage & Widows Centre), and strengthen our spiritual and educational programs. We firmly believe that this new facility will serve as a beacon of hope and a center for spiritual transformation for generations to come, enabling us to fulfil our mission more effectively within the community and beyond.

## KEMAKOBA CHURCH REPORT

### 1. Executive Summary

This report outlines the progress and urgent need for funding to complete the roofing of the International Fellowship of Christian Assemblies (IFCA) Church in Kemakoba. Following successful evangelism efforts and significant spiritual growth, a permanent church structure has been erected. However, the absence of a roof leaves the congregation vulnerable to adverse weather, hindering worship and ministry activities. This report details the successful foundational construction and appeals for the remaining funds required to finalize the roofing.

### 2. Background: Growth and Vision in Kemakoba

Under the dedicated leadership of **Pastor Jane Robi Muniko**, the International Fellowship of Christian Assemblies in Kemakoba has experienced remarkable spiritual growth. Through recent evangelism initiatives, the message of Christ was warmly received, leading to **84 new members** accepting faith and undergoing baptism. This significant increase in congregation size underscored the urgent need for a dedicated and permanent place of worship. We are particularly grateful for the pastoral support and encouragement received from **Pastor Bob** and **Pastor Pennella**, who visited Kenya, alongside the diligent efforts of **Missionary John Lutomia**.

### 3. Progress and Current Challenges

We are pleased to report that, despite considerable challenges, the permanent structure of the Kemakoba Church building has been successfully completed. This achievement is a testament to unwavering faith, hard work, and divine intervention.

However, the church currently faces a critical impediment: **the lack of a complete roof**. Without a roof, the structure remains exposed to the elements, making it difficult for the congregation to gather consistently for worship, Bible studies, and other essential ministry activities due to rain and intense sun. The majority of the local community comprises peasant farmers who, despite their profound dedication, are unable to raise sufficient funds independently to address this critical need.

### 4. Financial Appeal for Roofing Completion

To finalize the construction of the church and provide a secure and dignified place of worship, the remaining essential components are **timber, iron sheets, nails and other roofing materials**.

The total estimated funds required to complete the roofing of the Kemakoba Church structure are **KSh 400,000**, which is equivalent to approximately **\$3,080 USD**. Securing these funds is paramount to ensuring the continuity and expansion of the vital work being done in Kemakoba.





## 5. Conclusion

The completion of the Kemakoba Church building is crucial for the spiritual development and community outreach of the International Fellowship of Christian Assemblies. By providing a fully roofed sanctuary, we can offer a stable environment for worship, discipleship, and fellowship, fostering continued growth and impact in the region. We earnestly appeal for support to reach our fundraising goal and bring this essential project to fruition, enabling the church to fulfill its mission without the hindrance of environmental challenges.

### 1. Executive Summary

This report provides a comprehensive overview of the International Fellowship of Christian Assemblies (IFCA) Kenya's vital Orphanage and Widows Programme. Rooted in our unwavering commitment to Christ's call to care for the vulnerable, this initiative currently supports **91 orphaned children** and **214 widows** across various communities, particularly within the Kuria Constituency. While significant strides have been made in providing educational opportunities for our children and fostering economic empowerment for our widows, this report highlights the ongoing challenges related to basic amenities, centralized care, and sustainable livelihoods. We gratefully acknowledge the consistent support from IFCA International, which has been instrumental in our efforts. However, to advance our mission and provide more holistic care, we earnestly seek additional partnership and funding, particularly for the establishment of a dedicated orphanage home and the expansion of sustainable economic projects for our widows. We believe that with continued divine favour and generous support, we can further transform lives and bring glory to God's name.

### 2. Introduction: Our Mandate to Serve

At the International Fellowship of Christian Assemblies in Kenya, our ministry is founded upon the timeless biblical principles of compassion, justice, and love, particularly for the most vulnerable among us. We are profoundly moved by the words of James 1:27, which declares, "Pure and undefiled religion before God and the Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their trouble, and to keep oneself unspotted from the world." It is this divine mandate that propels our dedicated efforts through the Orphanage and Widows Programme, a cornerstone of our community outreach and evangelistic mission in Kenya.

Our commitment extends beyond spiritual nourishment to addressing the holistic needs of individuals, recognizing that true faith is demonstrated through tangible acts of service. We believe that by upholding the dignity and well-being of orphaned children and struggling widows, we not only fulfill a scriptural command but also bear witness to the transforming power of God's love in practical ways. This programme is not merely an act of charity but a testament to our profound belief in the inherent value of every life and our conviction that God's grace can bring breakthrough even in the most challenging circumstances.



### 3. The Orphanage Programme: Nurturing Future Generations

The orphaned children under our care are truly a blessing from the Lord, and we are overjoyed to report that, by God's grace, they are thriving despite their challenging backgrounds. Our Orphanage Programme currently provides essential support to **91 precious children**, encompassing both boys and girls.

#### 3.1. Education: The Gateway to Breakthrough

At IFCA Kenya, we firmly believe that **education is the ultimate breakthrough for these orphaned children**. It is our conviction that investing in their schooling equips them with the knowledge and skills necessary to break cycles of poverty, achieve their God-given potential, and become contributing members of society and the church. We are immensely grateful to God that, through dedicated effort and the invaluable support we receive, **all 91 children are currently enrolled in school**, pursuing both Primary and Secondary High School education. This commitment to uninterrupted schooling is a foundational pillar of our programme, ensuring they have the opportunity for a brighter future.

#### 3.2. Current Challenges in Care

While their educational journey is secure, our children still face significant daily challenges in obtaining basic amenities. These include:

- **Clothing:** Adequate clothing for all seasons and occasions.
- **Food:** Consistent access to nutritious meals.
- **Shelter:** Stable and secure living environments.
- **Medical Access and Attention:** Crucially, access to timely and adequate medical care remains a considerable challenge. Children, by their very nature, are susceptible to various ailments, and prompt medical attention is often difficult to secure given their scattered living arrangements.

**Currently, these children are being supported from various homesteads, generously hosted by well-wishers** within the community. While we are deeply thankful for the compassion of these families, this dispersed living arrangement presents logistical complexities in providing consistent oversight, unified care, and particularly, centralized medical access.





## 4. Sustaining the Programme: Current Support and Future Vision

### 4.1. Partnership with IFCA International and Self-Sufficiency Efforts

We extend our deepest gratitude to **IFCA International Headquarters**, whose faithful contributions have been a consistent lifeline for our Orphanage Programme. While these funds are truly a blessing, the sheer scale of needs for 91 children means that the support, though significant, is **not always sufficient** to meet every demand. Nevertheless, with prudent stewardship, we have prayerfully managed to share what we receive to cover the most pressing needs of the children, prioritizing their education.

In our pursuit of long-term sustainability and to supplement the invaluable international support, **IFCA Kenya** has initiated several **income-generating projects** designed to empower the children and the programme itself:

- **Chicken Farm:** A thriving chicken farm has been established, providing both a source of protein and a marketable product.
- **Corn Farming:** We have engaged in corn farming, yielding essential food staples and surplus for sale.

The proceeds generated from the sale of produce from these projects are meticulously channeled back into the programme, primarily to **subsidize school fees** and ensure that, alongside the support from **IFCA International**, every child remains securely enrolled in school. This dual approach exemplifies our commitment to self-reliance where possible, coupled with a deep appreciation for the vital external partnership.

### 4.2. Vision for a Centralized Orphanage Home: A Place of Refuge

Our heartfelt prayer and most pressing request for the Orphanage Programme is the establishment of a **centralized orphanage home**. This dedicated facility would revolutionize the care we can provide. Bringing the children together under one roof would offer:

- **Enhanced Security and Stability:** A safe, consistent, and nurturing environment.
- **Improved Oversight and Care:** Facilitating easier management, emotional support, and uniform provision of basic amenities.
- **Centralized Medical Access:** Crucially, a dedicated home would make it far easier to provide **regular medical access and attention**. We envision the possibility of establishing a **small dispensary within the orphanage home**, staffed by visiting medical professionals or a dedicated nurse, to address the health needs of the children promptly and effectively.

**Praise God**, we already possess **land at the New IFCA Kenya Headquarters** suitable for constructing such an orphanage home. Our immediate and most sincere need is for the **funds** required to build and equip this much-needed sanctuary. We humbly lay this request before the Lord and before our dear partners at IFCA International Headquarters, trusting in their generosity and God's abundant provision.





## 5. The Widows Programme: Restoring Hope and Dignity

### 5.1. Genesis of the Programme: Responding to Crisis

The establishment of our Widows Programme was a direct response to a deeply tragic and pressing need within the communities surrounding our headquarters in the **Kuria Constituency**, particularly spanning Kuria East and West. Historically, these areas have been plagued by **inter-community clashes and conflicts**, which, over time, have resulted in a significant and heartbreaking loss of male lives. Consequently, our churches across the constituency witnessed a dramatic increase in the number of women left as widows, often without traditional means of support and facing immense hardship.

Recognizing these beloved women as integral members of our church families, **IFCA Kenya** felt a profound spiritual and moral obligation to extend tangible support. Our programme was thus initiated to provide care, solace, and practical assistance to these resilient women who had endured such profound loss.

### 5.2. Current Support and Empowerment Initiatives

By the grace of God and through the limited resources available to **IFCA Kenya**, we have begun to implement initiatives aimed at empowering our **214 widows**. Our focus is on fostering self-sufficiency and ensuring they can earn a modest, dignified living. So far, our support has included:

- **Provision of Milk Cows:** Several widows have been blessed with milk cows, offering a sustainable source of nutrition for their families and a product (milk) that can be sold to generate a small, consistent income.
- **Small Chicken Farms:** In a similar vein to the children's project, we have assisted widows in establishing small chicken farms. These farms provide eggs for consumption and sale, further contributing to their food security and enabling them to earn a small living.

While these initiatives have brought much-needed relief and a measure of independence, the **scale of the need among 214 widows is vast**, and the current level of support from **IFCA Kenya** alone is **not substantial enough** to uplift every widow to a truly thriving state.

### 5.3. Future Needs for Enhanced Livelihoods

To enable our widows to earn a more substantial and sustainable living, their needs extend beyond the initial provisions. We earnestly pray for the resources to provide:

- **More Chickens:** Expanding the existing chicken farms with larger flocks would significantly increase egg production and, consequently, their income potential.
- **Poultry Machines:** Investment in basic poultry machinery (e.g., incubators, feed mixers) would allow for more efficient and larger-scale rearing of chickens, transforming these small projects into more robust enterprises capable of generating a truly substantial livelihood for them. This would empower them not just to survive, but to truly flourish.





## 6. Conclusion and Earnest Appeal

As we reflect on the journey of the International Fellowship of Christian Assemblies in Kenya, we are continually awestruck by God's faithfulness and the resilience of His people. The Orphanage and Widows Programme stands as a testament to our commitment to pure religion, impacting lives and offering hope in tangible ways. We are profoundly grateful for every prayer, every gift, and every act of partnership that has enabled us to reach this point.

However, the vision God has placed in our hearts for these precious children and dignified widows is far grander than our current capacity. To fully realize the potential of these programmes – to provide a holistic, secure home for our orphans with integrated medical care, and to empower our widows with truly sustainable livelihoods – we require significant additional support.

Therefore, our **sincere and heartfelt request** is directed to our beloved **IFCA International Headquarters** and to all compassionate partners. We humbly appeal for your generous financial assistance to **HELP US ESTABLISH THE ORPHANAGE HOME** and expand the economic empowerment initiatives for our widows. We trust in the Lord's abundant provision and in the spirit of Christian brotherhood and sisterhood that binds us together. May God bless you abundantly as you consider partnering with us in this vital work for His Kingdom. Together, we can continue to be instruments of His love and light in Kenya.

The World Impact Infusion Training Centre (WIITC) Kenya, operating under the esteemed banner of **IFCA Kenya**, is a cornerstone in the development of Christian leadership across the nation. Dedicated to equipping pastors and leaders for effective ministry, the Centre has seen remarkable growth, celebrating its first graduation of 250 students in 2023 and welcoming 378 new students for the current academic year. While the recent relocation of classes to the new **IFCA Kenya** Headquarters is a monumental blessing, several critical infrastructure and operational needs persist. **The most urgent need is for 400 chairs** to adequately seat our growing student body. Additionally, the Centre requires a kitchen block, two student hostels, support for internet costs, printing materials, and essential office computers. Addressing these needs is vital for sustaining the quality of training and expanding our capacity to impact God's Kingdom.

### 2. Introduction: Shaping Spiritual Leaders

The World Impact Infusion Training Centre (WIITC) Kenya stands as a beacon of Christian education and leadership development within the International Fellowship of Christian Assemblies in Kenya. Our unwavering mission is to meticulously train and equip dedicated Christian leaders, pastors, and ministers, empowering them with profound biblical knowledge, practical ministry skills, and a fervent passion for evangelism and discipleship. ### 3. Milestones and Transition: A New Chapter of Growth

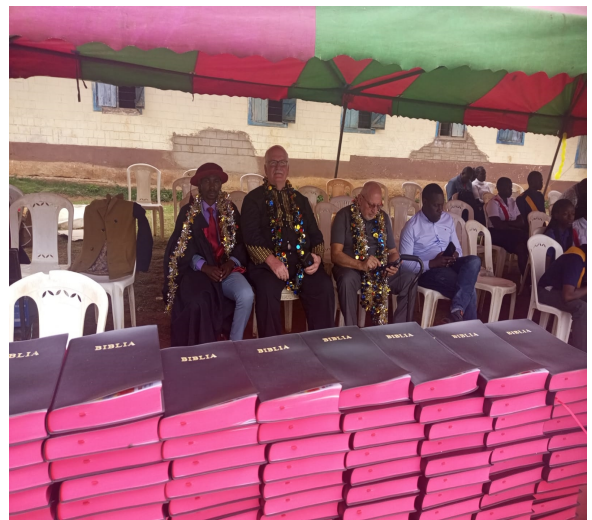
We are thrilled to report on significant milestones that mark a new chapter of growth and divine favor for the World Impact Infusion Training Centre Kenya.

In a glorious ceremony held in **2023**, the Centre celebrated its inaugural graduation, where **250 dedicated students** successfully completed their rigorous training and were commissioned for ministry. This momentous occasion was a powerful testament to the effectiveness of our curriculum and the commitment of our students and faculty. Following this success, we have witnessed continued enthusiasm for spiritual education. For the current academic year, we are blessed to announce that **378 new students** have successfully registered, eager to deepen their walk with Christ and enhance their ministry capabilities. This remarkable increase in enrollment underscores the urgent need and hunger for sound theological training in Kenya.

#### 3.2. Relocation to the New Headquarters

For a period, our training sessions were conducted under temporary arrangements, often utilizing **tents** as classrooms. While this demonstrated our resilience and determination, it presented obvious challenges regarding comfort, focus, and environmental stability for our students and instructors. We are therefore profoundly thankful to God for His divine provision in blessing us with the newly constructed **Kenya Christian Assembly Headquarters**. This magnificent facility will now serve as the permanent home for our classes and training sessions, providing a conducive, stable, and dignified learning environment for all our students. This transition marks a significant upgrade in our capacity and professionalism.



## 4. Urgent Needs and Essential Resources for Continued Impact

While the new headquarters provides an excellent foundation, the rapid growth in student enrollment and the expanded vision for the World Impact Infusion Training Centre necessitate several critical resources. Addressing these needs is paramount to maintaining the quality of education, ensuring student comfort, and enhancing the Centre's operational efficiency.

### 4.1. Immediate Priority: Student Seating (Chairs)

**The most urgent and pressing need confronting the World Impact Infusion Training Centre is the acquisition of adequate seating for our students.** With 378 students now enrolled, and a significant portion of classes moving into the new, permanent classrooms, we face an immediate shortfall of chairs. Currently, many students are unable to sit comfortably during lectures, which directly impacts their ability to focus, take notes, and fully engage with the teaching. We urgently require **400 sturdy chairs** to ensure that every student has a proper seat, fostering an environment conducive to learning and spiritual growth. Providing this fundamental amenity will immediately alleviate a major daily challenge and significantly improve the learning experience.

### 4.2. Essential Infrastructure Development

To support our growing student body and enhance the residential aspect of the Centre, we are praying for the provision of crucial infrastructure:

- **Kitchen Block:** The establishment of a dedicated **kitchen block** is essential to provide wholesome and nutritious meals for our students, particularly those who travel long distances or reside at the Centre. This facility would greatly improve student well-being and allow for efficient meal preparation.
- **Student Hostels (Ladies and Gents):** As we draw students from various regions, the provision of safe and comfortable on-site accommodation is vital. We urgently require the construction of **two separate hostel blocks, one for ladies and one for gentlemen**. These hostels would offer secure and supportive living environments, reducing logistical burdens for students and fostering a stronger sense of community within the Centre.

### 4.3. Operational and Technological Support

Beyond physical infrastructure, the modern educational landscape demands robust operational and technological support:

- **Internet Connectivity:** In an increasingly interconnected world, our training often includes **Zoom meetings and online resources**. However, the cost of internet connectivity in Kenya remains **high and financially challenging** for the Centre. Consistent, affordable internet access is crucial for remote learning, administrative functions, and global collaboration. Your support in subsidizing these costs would be profoundly appreciated.
- **Printing Materials:** For effective teaching and student engagement, we regularly produce class books and pamphlets. While we possess printers, the **acquisition of essential materials, particularly paper**, is a continuous challenge. Adequate supplies of paper ensure that every student has access to necessary study materials without interruption.
- **Office Computers:** To streamline administrative tasks, manage student records, facilitate research, and prepare teaching materials, the Centre is in dire need of modern technological tools. We require **at least three desktop computers** to support our office and academic staff in their daily operations.
